# Preserving history today for tomorrow's future




This past year was filled to the brim with restoration progress, both noticeable and under the surface. Each endeavor was strategic and purposeful, aimed at increasing the strength of our infrastructure for years to come. I owe a great deal of gratitude to those who have worked tirelessly to orchestrate this process with thoughtful precision.

We accomplished very large-scale renovations, from major roof repairs and replacement to new gutter systems as well as structural reinforcement. While work was being completed, both inside and out, we continued to fill the building with our signature projects, like our vibrant Youth Theatre Program, popular Buy Local Marketplaces, weddings and private events, a successful Broadway Theatre League season and so much more. Our goal was to move through this process with as little impact to our patrons as possible, and I can confidently say we achieved just that.

By the time you're reading this report, the next major phase of our restoration will be completed: our beautiful Weinberg Theatre, which has been restored and repaired from top to bottom. We are eager to get started with our 2025-26 season, where this space will be better than ever before in many aspects, not limited to its appearance. Our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual fundraiser, *Curtain Call: Make Some Noise*, was very successful in raising funds for our new, state-of-the-art sound system. This long-awaited project also received support from several other generous donors and foundations, and we could not be more grateful. The new system will not only benefit our patrons and improve their enjoyment, but also our organization economically.

It is truly a privilege to work with such a dedicated and hard-working Board of Directors and staff, and we are deeply appreciative to our faithful patrons, supporters and volunteers. Together, we will make a lasting impact on the Scranton Cultural Center so that it is available for the enjoyment of generations to come.

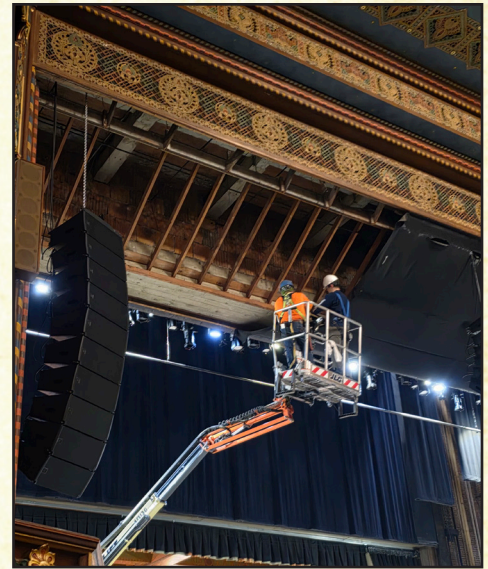
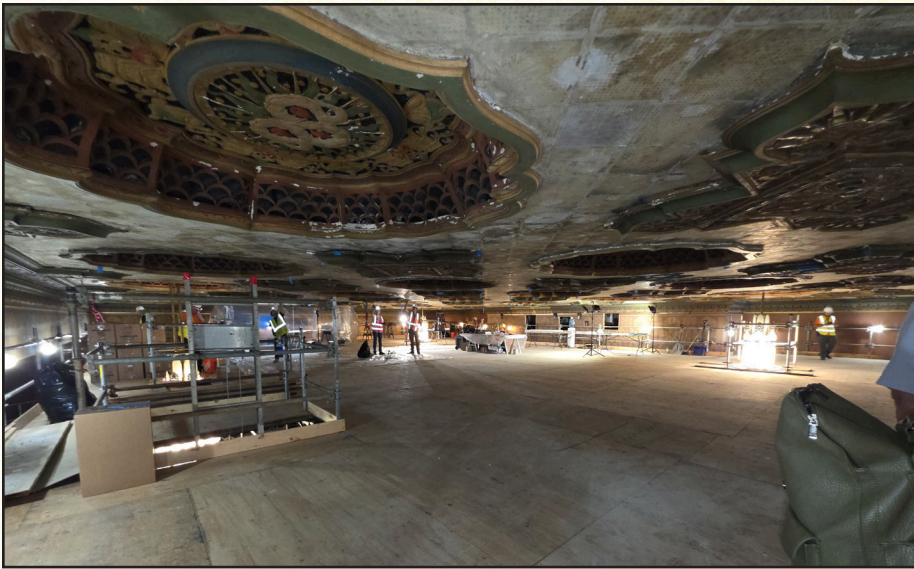

# Facilities Highlights

In spite of occasional setbacks, the restoration project is moving ahead and on schedule. Given the amount of building activity regarding construction crews, we have managed to keep operations running virtually seamlessly by strategically and diligently staging equipment based on construction needs. As it stands, our restoration project is at approximately 64% completion.



# Celebrated Accomplishments

- All seven roofs were replaced. Gutter and flashing work will continue into Fall 2025.
- Restored stained glass doors on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor have been reinstalled. Window work continues throughout the building, including in Shopland and Craftsmen Halls.
- Work continued on plaza and patio main entrance doors, as well as theatre exit doors to improve safety and energy efficiency.
- Our Grand Ballroom curtain, which was replicated with historical accuracy by MTL, Inc., was installed in December 2024.
- Exterior mortar joint repairs are 30% complete.
- Scaffolding was erected in June 2025 from floor to ceiling in the Weinberg Theatre to enable its full restoration. This work included removal and replacement of over 2,600 damaged Celotex ceiling tiles, and close to 1,700 decorative plaster ornaments. One of the most exciting parts of this project is the recreation of the decorative proscenium arch that has been missing since the 1980s when it collapsed.
- Continued maintenance of all HVAC and plumbing systems to keep our building functional and our patrons comfortable.

## NEW SOUND SYSTEM

In Spring of 2025, we purchased and installed a new, state-of-the-art sound system, which will serve us both acoustically and financially for years to come. The project was made possible with the generous support of **The Masonic Temple and Scottish Rite Cathedral Association (MTRCA)** and **Williams Company**, and grants secured from the **Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC)** and the **American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)** through the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Funds from our 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Curtain Call also benefited the project.

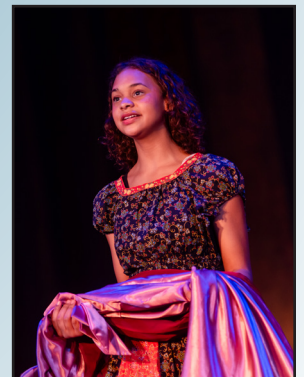
# SCC Youth Theatre Program



The SCC Youth Theatre Program's 11<sup>th</sup> annual Summer Camp achieved record enrollment, featuring 3 full-scale musicals (*Emma! A Pop Musical JV*, *Willy Wonka KIDS*, and *Disney's Frozen JR*), and 5 themed sessions. The 2024-25 season continued with *Disney's Finding Nemo KIDS*, *The Lightning Thief: The Percy Jackson Musical*, *Shrek the Musical*, and an ambitious 24-hour production of *Disney's High School Musical JR*. Students also performed at community events such as Lackawanna County's Art in the Park, St. Joseph's Festival, the WEJL Tower Lighting, and SCC events, Breakfast with Santa and Curtain Call. Field trip opportunities included the History Mystery Scavenger Hunt and a sold-out *Shrek* school performance for 1,710 attendees.
